Presidents Report

Hello Members:

Spring is here, so it is time to get the boat ready for another fishing season. Check all your reels and replace with new line where needed and sharpen your hooks. Also, don't forget to check the expiration dates on your flares and make sure your life jackets are in good shape. We want our fishermen to be safe on the water and in this regard, please remember that Channel 16 is the distress channel and should always be used in case of an emergency. Your ship-to-shore radio will alert the Coast Guard to your position fix on the water, as well as other boaters in your area. Remember, other boaters are required to respond to a distress call that is life threatening if they are near by. Your cell phone can be used if your radio is dead. Always call the Coast Guard directly (PH: 920-452-5115) not 911. Calling 911 would create delays, and these delays could cost you your life. Also, I recommend that all boaters carry a cable cutter on board at all times in case your cable gets caught on obstacles such as nets, buoys, shipwrecks or the lake bottom. Also make sure the cutters you have on hand can actually cut a downrigger cable. The gill nets are out in the water and are currently located south, southeast from the harbor in a depth of 55 to 120 feet. In the future, this information will also be posted on our website and at The Wharf and Anglers Avenue. Don't forget to register your winning fish for cash prizes in our club's fishing contest. I want to thank Nautilus Marine Electronics for a great presentation at our April meeting, as well as Glen Seger for a presentation on his trap nets. Our May meeting will take place at The Wharf along the boardwalk for our annual "Ride A Charter Boat" event. I want to wish everyone a successful and safe 2011 fishing season.


Gas Discounts Available at Marathon Station to Club Members

The Marathon Gas station located at 905 Indiana Avenue is offering a discount to club members on fuel purchases. Members of the Sheboygan Area Great Lakes Sport Fishermen club will receive a 3 cent discount per gallon if paid in cash or a 1 cent discount per gallon if a credit card is used. With the rising cost of gasoline this summer this is welcome news and should save our members a few dollars. Depending on how much fuel you use during the coarse of the fishing season, this could more than pay for your yearly club membership fee. All that is needed to receive your discount is to show your membership card when you are making your payment. Please note that in addition to gas, Marathon also carries a variety of snacks, sandwiches, coffee, cold beverages, ice, and bait. This is a great opportunity for our membership, so please consider the conveniently located Marathon station for all your fuel purchases. Trap Net Safety

With the start of the 2011 fishing season upon us, it is time to review trap net safety. Every Lake Michigan boater and fisherman should be familiar with commercial trap nets. Traps net locations usually change throughout the season. Commercial trap nets are used all summer in depths between 75 and 150 feet in Lake Michigan waters of Wisconsin. However, between June 29th and Labor Day the nets are confined to the restricted areas. The best way for the commercial fisherman and the sport fisherman to coincide with one another is education. Trap nets are set perpendicular to shore with the mouth or inlet of the net facing the shoreline. They are marked with buoys so boaters are aware of the net locations. An orange, double flagged anchored buoy marks the beginning of the net while a black or dark flagged buoy marks the lake ward end of the net. Between the double orange flags and the black or dark colored flag is a single orange flagged buoy that represents where the pot of the net is located. Two wings come off the mouth of the net and are marked with orange buoys that extend up to 600 feet from the anchor. As seen in the diagram below, the net is completely marked. Boaters need to be aware of what the different colored buoys represent. When approaching buoys, the boater should give a 600 foot berth around the nets. Also note the overall length of the net can be up to 2500 feet. That's almost a half mile! Boaters should always have a pair or two of wire cutters on board in the unlikely event they would need to cut entangled lines or cables. Give the line or cable some slack then immediately cut it. It is dangerous to cut a line under tension. If a propeller were to get entangled, keep the bow of the boat heading into the waves and shut off you engines. Never get into the water to attempt to untangle lines or fishing gear. Lake Michigan is a big lake and it can be shared safely by all. All boaters need to have an understanding of how trap nets work, where they are located and how they are marked. Every boat should have two good pairs of wire cutters on board to use in case of entanglement. Education is the key to everyone having a safe and enjoyable time on the water.
